Milford - Microburst Event

On Tuesday, July 16th, the Town experienced a microburst storm with winds up 95 miles per hour in the Hilton Homes neighborhoods causing severe damage to residential properties, vehicles, structure, and utilities. In total, six homes were deemed uninhabitable with many more homes and structures left with varying degrees of damage due to the falling trees and limbs. Emergency Management Departments from Milford and surrounding communities, Public Works crews, and Eversource worked tirelessly throughout the evening and following days to clear the roadways, ensure the safety of residents, inspect properties and restore power to the area.

We truly appreciate the efforts and dedication of our Emergency Services and Public Works Departments. Our Town is extremely fortunate to have such an experienced, well-coordinated multi-department team to manage emergency situations such as these. We would also like thank the communities of Merrimack, Peterborough, Lyndeborough, and Wilton for allocating personnel and resources to assist the Town. Representatives Maria Perez and Peter Petrigno provided needed boots on the ground while Representative Vanessa Sheehan continued to communicate the needs of the community to various agencies. Lastly, we would like thank the community for continuing to assist those individuals and families affected by the storm.
